Introduction

- What is the rule?
 - ACH Web entries are required to be validated. This applies to the first use of an account number, or change to the account number.
- What does “validation” mean?
 - The account number to be used for the web ACH is a legitimate, open account.
- Why is the happening?
 - Federal rules being enforced by the National Automated Clearing House Association (NACHA) require all web ACH payments to be validated after March 19, 2022. [Learn](#) more from the NACHA Resource Center.
